Course Information	<p>The normal workload per semester is 5 modules. Students are normally required to take at least 3 modules from within the subject area of the Exchange Agreement and may take a further two modules outside this subject area. Exchange students are limited to a <u>maximum</u> of 5 modules and a <u>minimum</u> of 4 modules per semester. Each course is awarded 6 ECTS credits.</p>
On Campus Accommodation	<p>Campus accommodation is limited and is allocated on a first come first served basis. Booking forms must be accompanied by a 250 Euro booking deposit in order to reserve your accommodation.</p>
Off Campus Accommodation	<p>Off-campus residences are available. Parkview Hall is recommended.
