Healthcare and Medical Insurance	Most students register at the campus Health Centre under the National Health Service. EU students will qualify for free health care under the National Health Service. Non-EU students will also qualify if they are to study in the UK for at least three months. Students attending for less than three months will be covered for emergency treatment only, and must have additional coverage. This may be provided by a rider on an existing family insurance policy, or through separate private cover.
